Write a brief review and reflection of your school's 2020-2021 TSSA Plan. Bastian Elementary used TSSA funds to provide an Instruuctional Coach who worked with teachers. All Bastian teachers participated in FOSS and Blended Learning Profoessional Development and worked to implement both in their classrooms. We also purchased technology to be able to move lower grades to one-to-one in order to more fully utilize blended learning. Consumable materials were also purchased to ensure FOSS kits could be used appropriately with each class. Finally, Bastian used TSSA funds to open and staff a Wellness Room. As we move into the 21-22 school year we have learned that the Wellness Room has created a safe place for students and staff to regroup and reset to be successful through the day. FOSS and Blended Learning increased student engagement and gave teachers a positive focus to integrate literacy. Our Instructional Coach was able to reach both new and veteran teachers as this year presented challenges beyond a typical school year. Many who might not have been as open in the past, welcomed a fresh set of eyes and positive interaction that led to reflection and growth.
